H. Reports from the Manager

Manager Scheuer reported to the Board that in the future with the rising Covid19 numbers and the flood issues that some of the meetings may take place by Zoom and notifications would be sent if that were the case.

I. New Business

1. Flood Debris Contract Award

Manager Scheuer presented a contract in the amount of \$331,065 (see attached) with SDR to remove all the flood debris. Alderman Hamlett made a motion to approve the contract with SDR as presented. Alderwoman Smith seconded the motion. motion carried.

2. Debris Monitoring Contract

Alderwoman Smith made a motion to approve the monitoring contract as presented. Alderman Hamlett seconded the motion. Motion carried.

3. <u>Temporary Office Housing</u>

Manager Scheuer reported to the Board that it was necessary to have temporary office space for staff to operate at this time. Manager Scheuer asked the Board to approve the temporary office space because all office personnel were displaced and basically working from the parking lot. Alderwoman Smith made a motion to approve the temporary office set-up. Alderman Hamlett seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Alderman Hamlett commented that with the forecasted amount of rainfall, the large number of debris piles, road closures still in the downtown area, coupled with the pure fact that Town staff were near exhaustion that he would like to see the Labor Day parade cancelled so he suggested setting another emergency meeting to discuss the issue. Alderwoman Smith stated that she agreed that Alderman Hamlett had very legitimate concerns and that the devastation was all around the community. Alderwoman Smith suggested that Alderman Shepard and Mayor Smathers be phoned and added to the discussion. Alderman Shepard stated that he could agree with the rationale for cancelling the Labor Day parade. Mayor Smathers stated that he respectfully disagreed with cancelling the parade as it would give the citizens something to enjoy something and take a break for a short time. Mayor Smathers stated that he did understand that Town was upside down and that the rebuilding would take a long time but that is why he felt that the parade signified hope and resilience. Mayor Smathers asked if a motion was on the floor. Alderman Hamlett made a motion to cancel the Labor Day parade. Alderwoman Mull seconded the motion. All members voted in favor of cancelling the Labor Day parade.
